American Literature/Enlightenment Period (1760s-1820s ...

The first book-length edition was published in Paris in 1791. The first English edition, a retranslation of this French edition, was published in London in 1793. A masterpiece of wit and style, Franklin's autobiography has been reprinted innumerable times and still is considered one of the most influential memoirs in American literature.
