Error analysis studies, however, have indicated that certain errors recur among language learners of various L1 backgrounds and seem to be more related to the intrinsic difficulty of the subsystem involved than cross-lingual influence.

The predictions are not always borne out. Weak version starts with learner errors and explains at least a subset of them by pointing to the

The process of learning requires that CA takes place BEFORE. The Error Analysis AFTER the learning process. Contrastive analysis is inclusive because it has applied, pedagogical outcomes. By identifying similarities and differences, CA PREDICTS possible areas of difficulty for the SL learner. 31
