Canada has about 9% of the world's forests. Each year over the last 25 years, about 7,466 forest fires have occurred. The total area burned varies widely from year to year, but averages about 2.5 million hectares annually.: Only 3% of all wildland fires that start each year in Canada grow to more than 200 hectares in area.
