Johannes Tinctoris, in his Liber de arte contrapunctio 1477, remarked on recent developments in the art of music and placed Johannes Ockeghem at the head of an exalted list of composers whose works exuded divine sweetness: Although it seems beyond belief, there does not exist a single piece of music, not composed within the last forty years, that is regarded by the learned as worth hearing.

One of his earliest works is based on a plainsong that was sung at Cambrai as part of the Missa ad tollendum schismam. Du Fay's turn toward paraphrased cantus firmi led him to largely abandon the free cantilena style in liturgical and ceremonial works.

His other theoretical works include Proportionale musices, dealing with musical notation, and Liber de arte contrapuncti, a survey of the art of composition as practiced in the late 15th century. His best-known composition is his Missa l'homme armé .
