Your growing space may require watering more or less often. Orchids generally want a wet-dry cycle of some sort (to mimic the rain). For plants like Phalaenopsis, you should water when the mix has become dry (not BONE dry, but "unmoist"). Stick your finger into the mix to see if it is still moist near the center.

1. Create the right temperature for your orchid. Most orchids originate from a tropical climate, meaning good air, plenty of light, and 12-hour days (365 days a year). The temperature (depending on the species of orchid) should range between 65 to 75 degrees Fahrenheit (18.3 to 23.8 degrees Celsius).

Bark doesn't hold much water and drains quickly, which makes it a good choice for orchids like Phalaenopsis and Cattleya that need to dry out between waterings. Other orchids such as lady's slipper and nun's orchid like more dampness, and will do better if you don't let them dry out.

Tips for Indoor Orchid Care . Caring for your orchid is pretty simple. During the summer months, water it weekly and heavily. Let the water drench the roots and fill up the pebble tray. It doesn't hurt every so often to put the plant in the kitchen sink and really soak it down. Don't worry, you won't kill it as long as it's allowed to dry out afterward.

Orchids usually appreciate misting with a spray bottle. If the plant has aerial roots growing up out of the pot, those roots will especially appreciate getting some moisture. You can also set up a humidity tray: put water in the bottom of a tray, with enough gravel that a plant set on top does not sit in the water.
