You should get chickenpox vaccine within 3 to 5 days of being

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exposed. Even if more than 5 days have passed since you were exposed, vaccination with two doses is still recommended to protect against future exposures. You need 2 doses of vaccine separated by minimum of 28 days.

These viruses infect many tissues during primary infection and then become dormant; they can reactivate later to cause disease.
