The Berlin Wall (German: Berliner Mauer) was a barrier that divided Berlin from 1961 to 1989, constructed by the German Democratic Republic (GDR, East Germany) starting on 13 August 1961, that completely cut off (by land) West Berlin from surrounding East Germany and from East Berlin until it was opened in November 1989. Its demolition officially began on 13 June 1990 and was completed in 1992.

The Berlin Wall was a guarded concrete barrier that physically and ideologically divided Berlin from 1961 to 1989. The barrier included guard towers placed along large concrete walls, accompanied by a wide area that contained anti-vehicle trenches, "fakir beds", and other defenses. Around half of this steady stream of refugees were young people under the age of 25.

During the Wall's existence there were around 5,000 successful escapes into West Berlin: 136 people were officially killed trying to cross (see List of deaths at the Berlin Wall) and around 200 were seriously injured. The sandy soil under the Wall was both a blessing and a curse for those who attempted to tunnel their way to West Berlin and freedom.

This Day In History: Construction of the Berlin Wall Began ...

The Berlin Wall became a concrete wall 3.5 to 4 meters high. The concrete slabs were filled with steel wires to make it more resistant. The top of the wall had a hemisphere shape, so it would be difficult to hold onto.

The construction of the wall involved thousands of construction workers. The American commanders in West Berlin were outraged by the building of the Wall. This was because they believed that it was unjust and it broke an existing agreement with regard to the administration of the city. One commander wanted to take a bulldozer and knock down the Wall. The building of the Wall shocked the Free World and was widely condemned.

Erected in the dead of night on August 13, 1961, the Berlin Wall (known as Berliner Mauer in German) was a physical division between West Berlin and East Germany. Its purpose was to keep disaffected East Germans from fleeing to the West. When the Berlin Wall fell on November 9, 1989, its destruction was nearly as instantaneous as its creation.
